REPORT TO A.G.M. BY RETIRING CHARMAN DR NOEL BREGORY ON 15-MAY 2013 Welcome to the 2013 AGM.

I am going to keep this report on 2012 brief because of the limited time available. The main event of the year was the Biennial Dinner in June which enabled us to make about £27,000 for children's charities in Jordan and provides an enjoyable occasion for our members and guests. This year there were over 300 people attending led by our Royal Patrons. There is a full report on the dinner and a list of donations made to charities on our web site and in the newsletter. I wanted to express my gratitude to the events committee for organising this – Emma Bodossian, Zina Illya, Jilly Goddard Randa Khayat – and also to Hania Muhaisen for her quiet work in enabling us to receive substantial sponsorship.

This event absorbs an enormous amount of effort by the Events committee supported by other members of the Council and does tend to exhaust our energies and we arranged only two other events last year. However, we have used the web site to publicise other events of interest to our members, including lectures by HRH Princess Badiya, lectures on Jordanian affairs at the LSE, two lectures organised by the Council for British Research on the Levant (which maintains an important institute in Amman and is a base for research on a range of subjects by Briotish scholars in Jordan). We joined the British Egyptian Society in a private visit to the British Museum's exhibition on

hope too we can do the same on 20 August for the Pompeii and Herculaneum Exhibition. We have been discussing with the ambassador a reception he and his wife will give for A-JS members but we decided to postpone this until the summer so that the garden can be used.

Other issues of note are:

- We have decided to upgrade the web site again mostly to make it much easier for officers of the council to make changes and keep it up to date themselves rather than have to go through a third party.
- We have also been updating our membership records. We have a very large number of life members but we found that others on our list have not paid subscriptions for at least three years and we have no contacted all of them to ask whether they wish to remain members of the society.
- Regrettably we had to cancel a holiday tour of Jordan scheduled for last autumn because of a lack of response from members. We have a very successful tour in 2010 and Emma plans to look at this again next year.
- The AJS proposes making a special donation from our reserves to
 Jordanian charities coping with the influx of Syrian refugees.

As this is my last day as Chairman, I wanted to record my personal thanks to all members of the council for their help but especially to Emma Bodossian, our honorary secretary and David Valance our Treasurer who do an enormous amount of work behind the scenes. We should all thank the events committee Emma Bodossian for their organisation of events and arranging the catering, not least today. I have very much enjoyed my time as chair and my only regret is that I wish I could have done more. I am glad to see that my predecessor Christopher Battiscombe is here.

I am delighted that Lady Olga Maitland has agreed to be proposed as my successor. It is very good for the society that we should have a high profile chair. I think most of you k now of Lady Olga. She was a journalist and commentator on the Sunday Express and daily Mail (as well as the BBC) becoming a member of parliament from 1992 to 1997. More recently she has been active in chairing Algeria British Business Council and President 'Defence and Security Forum' 1991. But apart from all that she has great energy and a great enthusiasm for Jordan and I will make a great contribution to the A-JS. Finally, I would to thank our Royal patrons for their tremendous support and to Mazen Homoud, the Jordanian ambassador and our honorary president for sparing so much of his time.

It is quite rare that we are able to orgnaise an event at which both of our honorary presidents are in attendance. I am delighted that Peter Millet is able to speak to us this evening. He has been in Amman since early 2011 and he and his team in Amman have always been most helpful to the society. He has to leave at 7 but will speak for about 20 minutes on the British role in reform in Jordan.
